Situation report 1. WHO 05 Jan 2010. Solomon Islands earthquake 4th January 2010. Two earthquakes magnitude 6.6 and 7.2, with epicentres West South West of the island of Honiara struck the Solomon Islands within an hour of each other. The earthquakes and subsequent large waves and landslides damaged houses and boats on the islands of Rendova and Tetepare. Initial reports show that around 200 - 500 families have been displaced due to the earthquakes. Assessment on the health impact of this emergency is being carried out

Scientists build first worldwide earthquake alert system

South Pacific islanders experienced four major earthquakes in less than 11 hours earlier this month. A new project aims to create a quake warning system that may save thousands of lives. The Global Earthquake Model or GEM, a non profit organization of scientists and researchers is well into a five year project to gather existing knowledge about earthquake prone areas and the risks involved. GEM will then take those volumes of information and using a complex software program - create a worldwide picture of the planet's stress prone areas, the risks to life and structures in vulnerable areas, and the ways to reduce that risk, including better building techniques and emergency preparedness
