Recovery Action Plan : for Rendova earthquake and tsunami ; January 2010 ; Solomon Islands. Action plan for Rendova Island disaster

Two earthquakes (6.5 and 7.2) struck near Rendova and Tetepare Islands some 88km SSE of Gizo, in Western Province on Monday 4th January 2010. Significant impacts were localised around the Southern half of Rendova Island. The village of Retavo was destroyed by a tsunami wave of 4.5 - 5m with a run up of 200 - 300m resulting in the loss of 6 households affecting 31 people. Nine other villages were impacted by the earthquake affecting a further 555 households. In addition major landslides had affected the gardens and livelihoods of the 561 affected households. Recovery Action Plan was formed for the response to the communities of Rendova

Regional Natural Disaster Relief Fund

The continuing problem of recurring hurricanes and other natural disasters common to island members led to the establishment of the Regional Natural Disaster Relief fund. A study was commissioned to develop guidelines for the establishment of a viable fund for island members of the Forum; the study was conducted in January 1976 by a CFTC-funded consultant, James Lewis. Recommendations of the study were accepted by member governments at the Nauru meeting in July 1976. The objective of the fund is to provide member countries with a readily available source of financial relief in the wake of natural disasters

UNOCHA Pacific Situation Report 2, Thursday, January 27, 2010. Tropical Cyclone Nisha is approaching toward Cook Islands, located near 17.7 South/167.1 West at 280300UTC or 450 miles west-northwest of Rarotonga, Cook Islands. A TC warning is now in force for Palmerson Atoll, which has around 63 populations according to 2006 census while a TC alert remains in force for the rest of the Southern Cook Islands. It is expected to sustain winds of 35 knots close to the centre possibly increasing to 45 knots in the next 12 to 24 hours.

Bulletin no 6. 8/01/2010. The continuous ash emission activity of the Gaua volcano that begun on Monday 14th December 2009 with the significant emissions of ashes is still ongoing. This was accompanied by explosions heard from the villages on the 29th of December 2009. This eruptive phase is different from previous activities with thicker and darker plumes. These changes reflect the evolution of the source (alimentation) of the volcano. Ash falls continue to persist in the western part of Gaua and with the changes in the direction of the wind; it is possible that ash falls may also be experienced in the eastern part of the island
