The teams are destined to undertake rapid assessments in Rennell / Bellona and Makira Provinces for seven days. The assessments will provide much clearer picture of the situation on the impacted areas as the assessments teams are now currently in the field. Regarding the other four Provinces who are also impacted, namely Guadalcanal, Malaita, Isabel and Temotu, the NDMO is in constant contact and closely monitoring the progress of their preparation for assessments which will occur consecutively later this week or next week

Fiji Red Cross Society situation report 11 on TC Tomas, 2000hrs, Sunday, 26/03/2010. TC Tomas which affected Fiji on the 15 and 16th of March caused significant damage in several communities in the north and eastern parts of Vanua Levu and surrounding islands, in Lomaiviti and Lau groups. Approximately 480 dwelling houses have been destroyed and over 1,100 partially damaged. Relief operations continue including the provision of food and non-food items. Over 6,800 people have been assisted directly in the distributions of non-food items by FRCS relief teams. The most affected population have been identified from collated assessment data between FRCS and other DISMAC teams. Field verification and distributions of FRCS relief were carried out independently by FRCS relief teams

OCHA situation report 4 on TC Tomas, 26/03/2010. Rapid assessments by government teams have identified 517 totally destroyed houses while 1,150 houses were partly damaged. The estimated damages to other sectors such as health, education and agriculture, including infrastructure, is so far estimated at almost FJ\$ 35 million, of which almost \$23 million is agricultural damage, mainly on Taveuni. The Fiji Government confirmed that priority areas for international assistance at this stage are: rehabilitation of education and health facilities, rehabilitation of damaged and destroyed houses, as well as other capital infrastructure, agriculture and additional food rations. Assessment teams are returning from affected areas and are expected to present findings early next week

Red Cross strengthens typhoid awareness campaign

FRCS, 29 Mar 2010. Red Cross volunteers are reaching out to the most remote districts along the Eastern Coast of Vanua Levu to carry assessments and provide initial relief. For the relief teams, the biggest challenge is on the ground communications. As volunteers conducting initial assessments return to their respective Branches in the Northern Division, Health Awareness teams are being deployed to the identified Typhoid "Hot Spot" areas. FRCS Health and Care Coordinator Marica Kepa has held briefings with Ministry of Health officials in Macuata and Cakaudrove including the Divisional Medical Officer for in the Northern Division regarding post TC Tomas health and hygiene aware programmes

The Fiji Times, Wednesday, March 31, 2010. The national damage estimate from hurricane Tomas now stands at close to \$63million. According to the National Disaster Management office the figures were still progressive. The agricultural sector topped the damage costs with close to \$45million in the North and \$3million in the Eastern Division. Damage to the education sector has been estimated at more than \$1million. Damage to roads in the Northern Division was \$4million and to the Eastern Division at more than \$5million. The result of the DDA conducted by the Fiji Government will be available early next week while the updated result of the Fiji Red Cross Society (FRCS) assessment will be ready by the end of this week. These two assessment reports will provide a better picture on recovery needs as well as residual humanitarian needs.
