This report covers the period 1 January to 31 December 2009. The Pacific region experienced both large and small disasters in 2009. The quick response of national societies to these disasters was due to their ability to work with the support of international and local partners to mobilize people, goods and equipment. This ability was born because of an ongoing regional commitment to integrated training and capacity development across the broad range of disaster management disciplines. Pre-positioned emergency relief items in each country also meant that help was immediately at hand for affected communities. The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) provided assistance to the majority of these operations by liaising with partner societies in the region in the area of mobilizing resources and supporting the national societies on reporting and information sharing with regional partners

**Papua New Guinea : storms set to intensify**

Date: 30 Apr 2010. Port Moresby, 30 April 2010 (IRIN) - Storms are set to intensify in Papua New Guinea (PNG), specialists warn, as the Pacific island nation grapples with the effects of climate change. The country is already highly prone to natural disasters - including earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, tsunamis, cyclones, river and coastal flooding, landslides, and drought. "As ocean surface temperatures rise, storms will increase in intensity. This is the driving factor," Bradley Opdyke, a scientist with the Department of Earth and Marine Sciences at the Australian National University told IRIN from Canberra

### **Earthquakes in Fiji**

Earthquakes are due to failure of rocks under stress. The fracturing along the fault causes vibrations or seismic waves which travel outwards in all directions from the fault and if the earthquake is large enough are recorded on sensitive seismographs around the world and can cause the ground to quake strongly, close to the fault. Unfortunately Fiji is within the "Pacific Rim of Fire", the zone of earthquakes and volcanoes which surrounds the Pacific Ocean. However, there are no volcanoes in Fiji and the number of earthquakes is somewhat less than for the most active areas around the Pacific

### **Tsunamis**

A tsunami is a series of travelling ocean waves of extremely long length and period, generated by disturbances associated with earthquakes occurring below or near the ocean floor. Eleven tsunamis have been recorded in Fiji, of which three were generated within Fiji waters. The most damaging tsunami was in 1953. It claimed five lives in Suva and Kadavu, and flooded parts of Suva City

**Impact of the 29 September 2009 South Pacific tsunami on Wallis and Futuna**

The 29 September 2009 South Pacific tsunami reached the islands of Futuna and Alofi, 650 km to the west of its origin, between 7am and 7:20 am on 30 September, local time. No warning was issued. The run-up heights and inundation distances at 41 sites around the islands were measured. The worst impact (4.5 m run-up; 85 m inundation; 3.8 m flow depth) was observed on Alofi's NW beach. On Futuna, maximum run-ups of 4.4 m on the eastern tip and 4.3 m on the NW tip of the island are associated with maximum inundations of 95 and 72 m, respectively. A flow depth of 2.2 m was inferred on the NE tip. The tsunami arrived as a drawdown of water with the reef exposed well below the lowest tides. It was followed by two positive waves of similar amplitude, ca. 4 min apart. Damage was mainly limited to salt-burnt vegetation and sediments deposited at the coast. There were no casualties, but a significant disaster was avoided because the tsunami arrived in the early morning at close to low tide
