Forecasting the heights of later waves in Pacific-wide tsunamis

Pacific-wide tsunamis remain dangerous for many hours (Mofjeld et al., 1999). Later tsunami waves threaten rescue and recovery operations, especially when they arrive at high tide. Such waves also endanger vessels in shallow water. For these reasons, emergency managers need wave height forecasts to help guide rescue and recovery operations. They also need them to decide when to issue the all clear. This paper presents a method to make such forecasts for sites near real-time reporting tide gages. The goal is to provide an adequate forecast as soon as possible following the local onset of a tsunami
